Mr. Willard P. McCrone conducted the meeting. The entire constitution was discussed and each provision was ammended and approved or approved as read.



MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF MAY 12, 1971 OF THE MARYLAND BUILDING OFFICIAL ASSOC.

The second meeting of the Maryland Building Officials Association was held opened by the President at 1:30 p.m. at the Other Barn in Columbia, Maryland.

The minutes of the April meeting were read by the Secretary and accepted.

Cards were distributed to all present to obtain membership information.

Mr. McCrone, President, suggested a seal for the organization should be adopted and requested suggestions for the seal. Mr. McCrone also requested suggestions concerning meetings and projects for the organization.

The President discussed B.O.C.A. affiliation and read the requirements necessary for affiliation.

Mr. Mueller, 1st. Vice President, made a motion that B.O.C.A. affiliation be discussed with B.O.C.A. officials at the convention in Pittsburg. The motion carried. G.Y. Clark suggested obtaining a B.O.C.A. Charter as soon as possible. Motion carried.

Mr. McCrone discussed the purpose and background of the Maryland Building Officials Association and the importance of having such an organization.

The President stated that the Baltimore region committee did in fact affect State legislation in 1971. However, the effect was limited because of the lack of a State-wide Building Officials organization.

The State and such Federal organizations as H.V.D. are becoming more active in the field of Building Codes. And local Code officials are more effective if backed by a State-wide organization.

Mr. McCrone stated an aim of the organization was to obtain more members and to create an environment in which a Building Inspector can properly perform his job.

Mr. George Mueller felt the organization would help him as a Building Official by making possible to obtain the proper recognition for the individual inspector.

Mr. Mueller discussed the provisions of Senate Bill 559 and 560.

Mr. McCrone read provisions of the Bill concerning inspector training.

Mr. Mueller spoke on membership and the advantages of membership.

Mr. McCrone then explained the various types of membership.

A general discussion was held concerning the advantages and disadvantages of the lack of voting rights for associate members.


